

# At a Glance for Cannabis Import & Export Application and Licensing

Regulatory function of the licence	This licence allows material containing controlled cannabinoids to be brought to the Isle of Man	This licence allows material containing controlled cannabinoids to be sent from the Isle of Man to elsewhere.
When a licence isn't required	<p>- You do not require import or export licenses if you participate in the arrangement to import or export controlled cannabinoids but you do not come into contact with them.</p> <p>- You do not require import or export licenses if you transport controlled cannabinoids into or out of the Isle of Man for others, but you will require a transport licence to do this.</p>	
THC and CBN limits	There are no upper limits on the strength or concentration of active ingredients in the imported material.	<p>Unrefined materials can be produced using an extraction licence.</p> <p>Unrefined materials (but not biomass) can be imported using an import licence.</p>
Permitted materials	Any cannabis related product	Any cannabis related product
Testing	<p>None – testing occurs on the export licence.</p> <p>However if the GSC has reason to believe controlled drugs other than controlled cannabinoids are being imported, the import may be tested.</p>	<p>The GSC will understand your class of customer. If it non-commercial then your product will be tested before the export licence is granted.</p> <p>This test measures the presence of harmful ingredients – metals, mycotoxins, chemical residues.</p>
Fees	<p>In year 1, the fee is £10,000</p> <p>In year 2 onwards, £7,500</p>	<p>In year 1, the fee is £10,000</p> <p>In year 2 onwards, £7,500</p>
Co-licensing	<p>Licensees can hold any number of licence classes.</p> <p>Licensees with target markets outside the Isle of Man will require the export licence.</p>
