Pesticide & Fungicide permissions	Non-use of pesticides and growth regulators is assumed. If protection products must be used, the <u>Code of Practice</u> applies, and will trigger automatic sampling and lab testing prior to export.	
Maximum THC	No restrictions, except those imposed by route to market considerations.	
Licence fees	Year 1 -£47,250, Year 2 - £36,750	Year 1 -£21,000, Year 2 - £12,600
Dual licensing?	Class 3 and class 4 may be co-owned by the same licensee.	
Import/export	Separate licences; Year 1 - £10,500; Year 2 - £7,875	
Maximum licence fee	£62,500 for any number of licenses held. Operating on a rolling 12 month basis. The cap is automatically applied when each fee is paid.	
Licensing requirements	Isle of Man company required. Responsible person is IOM resident. Owners are people of integrity; Controllers are people of integrity and competence; Existing route to market exists; Source of wealth can be corroborated and is appropriate; Business plan is realistic.
